It wasn’t common knowledge, but we were operating under a deficit budget for a long time. Our operating expenses kept rising, but our subscriber base and the number of ads we took in didn’t keep up. I had been holding out against raising the subscription rates, because I realized that for most of our readers, financial choices might make you decide NOT to renew if the cost went up.


During the last year of our existence we were able to get a substantial break on our postage, and the cost per edition for the three editions prior to the final one were finally on the plus side of the ledger. We felt that with the way things were going, it would take us about a year to get our finances back to where they should have been.

However, because of the “agreement to disagree” with Scouts Canada, we had to pay full price for postage on the final edition, which just about wiped out the balance of our account. In effect, we went bankrupt, with assets far lower than our liabilities (the refunds due to subscribers for the unused portion of their subscriptions). If we had continued in operation, in the long run things would have worked out, because we were looking at other ways to cut costs and ways to increase revenues and we had started to make a *slight* profit on each edition.

Again, my personal apologies to all of you who supported us for so long. You suffered with us in our struggles to improve, and seemed to enjoy the way the magazine grew in size and style. I was a pleasure to be your editor and a disappointment that it came to an end.
